Triad Vice President, Roy E. Lewis, Jr., Retires

Woodinville, Washington, June 3, 2016 – Triad, a division of David Evans and Associates, Inc., announces the retirement of Roy E. Lewis, Jr., PE., LEED-AP®. Roy graduated from the University of Washington in 1977, worked a year for a Yakima firm and then was recruited to Triad by UW civil engineering classmate, Al Fure, Triad Senior Vice President and DEA Vice President. After seven years, Roy left Triad but rejoined the firm in 1994. In 2006, Roy was made Vice President and served as a member of its officers’ group, helping to guide Triad operations.



When asked what he considers to be the most meaningful part of his body of work, Roy said, “I’ve loved working on diverse, complex and challenging projects, but equally important are the times I’ve spent mentoring the young engineers and building lasting, win-win relationships based on trust and mutual respect with agency staff.”

Early memorable projects include Gleneagle, the 443-acre, master-planned community and golf course located in Arlington, Washington; Talus, the 630-acre, master-planned mountain village located in Issaquah, Washington – a project that Triad continues to work on today; and the time-critical, re-design of master-planned community, Issaquah Highlands. In addition, Roy was the project engineer on Lake Washington Ridge, one of the first single-family communities built in Newcastle, Washington, as well as 11, King and Snohomish County fire stations.

“Much has changed during Roy’s 28-year tenure, but one thing has remained the same – Roy’s passion for working with others in a collaborative and caring way to create vibrant, livable and enduring communities,” commented Triad President and DEA Vice President, Jeff Cox. “Besides being a talented engineer, he’s the one who brings in the donuts and apples, plays the practical jokes, and, even though he’s terribly busy, makes a point of walking around the office every day making personal connections. We’re going to miss his energetic presence on many levels.”

In addition to his professional contribution to Triad and its clients, Roy has a heart for community service. Recipients of his generosity over the years include Hopelink, Master Builders of King and Snohomish County and the Kirkland Chamber of Commerce.
